was originally named the
South Pacific County Community Foundation.

Today, with an expanded area of influence and updated name, the mission of the Pacific Community Foundation (PCF) is to demonstrate leadership in philanthropy to foster a dynamic community.

Our vision is that our community will thrive, with healthy families, and will provide opportunity for all ages.

PCF grows endowments, distributes grants and supports nonprofits throughout the Pacific County community on the south coast of Washington. While our original focus was on south Pacific County, today we work county-wide with nonprofit organizations to benefit all areas of our community. We also work outside our borders to benefit the larger community of the lower Columbia River, including west Wahkiakum County, which sends its children to school in Naselle.

We see our relatively small population, our rural setting and our remoteness as singular advantages ... for these foster a sense of togetherness and helping one another as friends and neighbors.




Message from Todd Wiegardt, President, Pacific Community Foundation

The year 2020 was a year of challenges and, sometimes, heartbreak for all of us. But it also was a year of encouragement and perseverance. The community rose to the challenges in extraordinary ways to meet the needs of our neighbors. We at Pacific Community Foundation are humbled we were able to take part in helping our community help itself. Thank you for your support.

Growth Over the Years

The Foundation's focus on increased outreach and broader community involvement has resulted in dramatic increases in participation and total giving. Individual contributions reached an all-time high in 2020 as many donors joined our monthly giving program, especially in support of efforts to mitigate the impact of the pandemic.





What Our Community Accomplished in 2020

We targeted two specific areas of giving in 2020:


- In the spring of 2020 we established six <u>Critical Needs Funds</u> to address the immediate needs of our community as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic.
 - o *Community Emergency Relief* Fund Grants to local nonprofits providing Covid-19 relief support services.
 - o *Community Food Fund* Grants to local food banks and other food providers.
 - Covid-19 Isolation Unit at OBHF Fund Grants to Ocean Beach Hospital Foundation in establishing an isolation unit for current and future Covid-19 patients.
 - Food 4 Kids Fund Support for securing and delivering food to school children at their homes during the Covid-19 remote learning and lockdowns.
 - Pacific County Immigrant Support Fund Helps immigrant families impacted by Covid-19, including rent, utilities and other critical needs.
 - o *Peninsula Pets Fund* Supports local animal shelter, keeping dogs and cats clean, safe, warm and cared for while they await adoption.

A total of 227 donations totaling \$39,860 were received and distributed in conjunction with these Critical Needs initiatives.

- Our regular twice-a-year **Grants Catalogs** were combined into a single effort in December focusing on year-end giving. This yielded the largest giving event in our history . . . Some 96 donations totaling \$31,070 supported ten local nonprofit organizations.
