### Support FROM our Communities

After extraordinary years of growth in 2019 and 2020 due, in part, to the Covid pandemic, donations in 2021 grew at a more normalized rate. Our existing donors were joined by new to support our donor-advised and endowment funds, monthly giving programs, and annual grant catalog.

Again in 2021, our regular twice-a-year Grants Catalogs were combined into a single December year-end giving effort. It was the largest giving event in our history - 131 donations totaling nearly \$41,000 supported the projects and initiatives of 18 local and regional nonprofit organizations and grant funds.

374 donations were made to our donor-advised and endowment funds, monthly giving programs, and Year-End Grant Catalog.

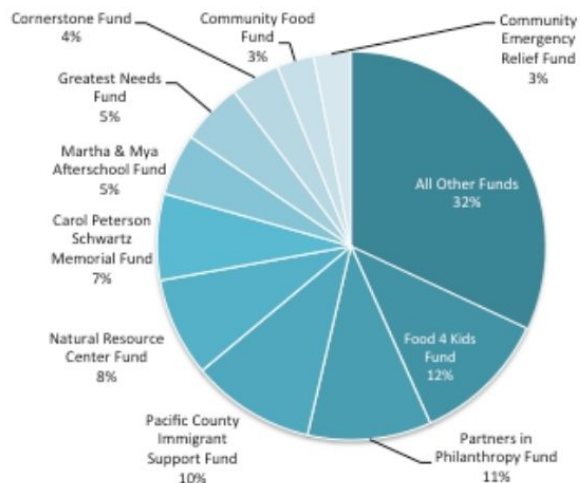

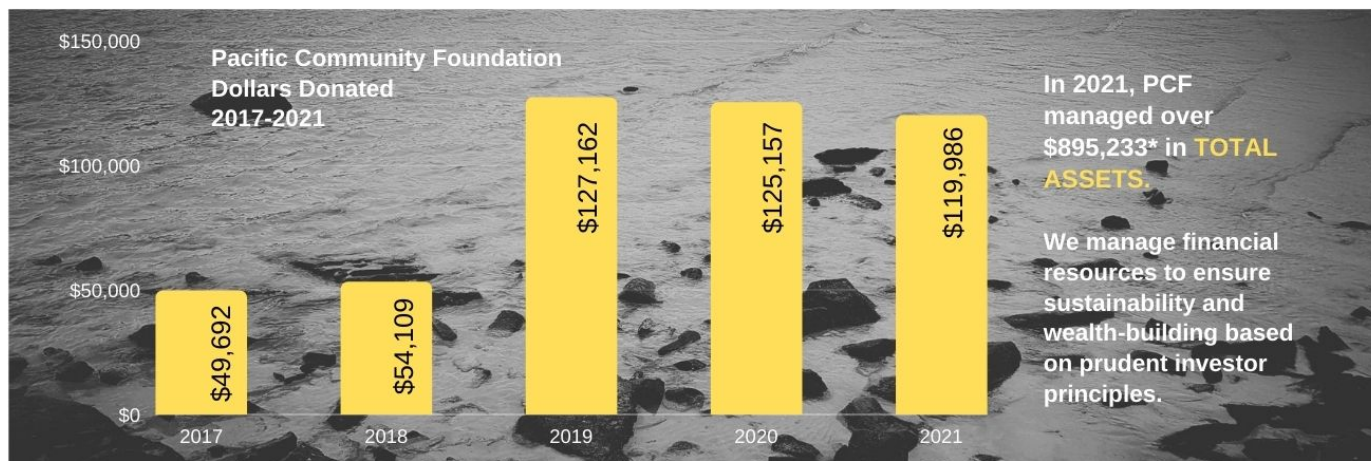
