Support FROM our Community

After years of growth and fluctuation related to the pandemic, donations leveled and PCF worked to make the best of challenging market conditions. Working through these challenges, we were excited to create one new fund and welcome 82 new donors to the foundation's donor community. New donors contributed \$9,000 in support of PCF emergency, program, endowment, and scholarship funds.

In 2022, PCF again organized and conducted a December grants catalog. With a record number of applicants, we ended up with 30 giving requests for the community to consider. This resulted in 273 donations totaling over \$50,000 supporting projects and programs of 30 local and regional nonprofit organizations.




