

REPORT TO NON-PROFITS AND DONORS

Message from Jerry Macy, President Pacific Community Foundation

As we end one year and begin another, we at the Pacific Community Foundation extend a special thanks to donors for their generosity and to the wonderful non-profits and amazing volunteers who work tirelessly to make our community a better place. We are grateful for your trust and for the opportunity to work with you on behalf of our community! We are excited to celebrate the successes of the past year and look forward to continued improvement in year ahead. While many details can be seen below, we especially want to share these highlights from 2023.

Giving - Donors provided nearly \$220,000 in donations in 2023, more than doubling the total from the previous year. The number of individual donors increased by 20%.

New Funds - Our community outreach expanded throughout the area, resulting in new community-focused funds including:

Support FROM our Community

Donations increased dramatically in 2023 as PCF created additional community funds and donors responded accordingly.

In 2023, PCF moved its annual Giving Catalog to October and saw a 20% increase from the previous year. Some 20 giving requests resulted in 168 donations totaling nearly \$60,000 to support much-needed projects and programs.



PCF Funds, Donor-Advised Funds and Endowments

In 2012 PCF started with five general funds (Cornerstone, Greatest Needs, Partners in Philanthropy, Endowment and Foundation). Since then nearly 40 funds have been established, tailored to specific needs and changing circumstances. Several of these focused on urgent response during the pandemic but most have emerged from the community itself. New funds are created each year to better support local needs. 
